Mr. Tony VanderVen begins his task as principal of the Canadian Reformed Teachers College (CRTC).

SEPTEMBER

The College opens in the basement of Hamilton's Cornerstone church building with Mr. Tony VanderVen (1981-1999) and Mr. Bill Horsman (1981-2004) as the two full-time faculty, with the support of several sessional faculty. The College

offers two diplomas: a one-year Diploma of Education and a three-year Diploma of Teaching. Six students are enrolled in the three-year program.



1991

MARCH

The College is incorporated under Letters Patent, with the Ontario Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations. Its new legal name is: Covenant Canadian Reformed Teachers' College

1993

Mrs. Christine van Halen-Faber, already a part-time lecturer, is appointed as a full-time faculty member.



2004



Mr. Allard Gunnink (2004 – 2018) is appointed as a full-time

faculty member.

The College moves to its current location at 410 Crerar Drive. The library now contains 12,000 items and moves into its own spacious room.

GRADUATION 2022 BETH STEL

On Friday, May 27th, the six persons forming the class of 2022 could formally graduate from Covenant Canadian Reformed Teachers College (CCRTC). The excitement was tangible as this was the first time since Graduation 2019 that family, friends and supporters could gather in person.

The evening began with a processional of the capped and gowned graduands. The Chairman of the Board, Mr. Bert Poort, formally opened the evening and after a few words of welcome with special mention of the College's 40th anniversary, introduced the keynote speaker, Dr. Art Witten, whose involvement with the College goes back to its beginning as a member of the founding board. His address was titled, "From one generation to another – then and now." Forty years ago – two generations – a single student graduated from CCRTC. In an

overview, Dr. Witten emphasized the faith commitment from all those who gave of time and talents to develop CCRTC. He spoke of the covenant reality within our communities. The name "Covenant" highlights the relationship between God and those working and studying there but also the relationship the graduands will have with the people in their new community as they go on to their own classrooms. The students in front of them in September have received the covenant promises from God in their baptisms. The theme text of the College, "Tell the next generation..." (Ps. 78), is now the calling of these graduands to equip their students to fulfill their own calling as prophet, priest and king. He urged the graduands to be involved in their school communities and to motivate their students to do the same. The theme text becomes reality when covenant children are taught by God's Word to recognize the battle lines between the seed of the serpent and of the woman. The LORD "extends His promises to frail people, who are made strong in Christ and are therefore, equipped to fulfill their obligation." He concluded by encouraging the graduands to rely on God who is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow.

Then, Dr. Christine van Halen-Faber spoke of privilege, defining it as "being endowed with a special right, with grace and with power; [it] is a gift." A public graduation ceremony is a privilege. It is a privilege to attend an institution of higher learning where God's name is central. The graduands are privileged to receive teaching appointments for the upcoming school year, DV. A lot is required of teachers to fulfill their commitment. But they are not alone. God provides His grace and strength plus colleagues and a community for support.

Mr. Keith Sikkema introduced each of the graduands prior to receiving their diploma. Receiving the Diploma of Education were

Patricia Bouwman and Joanna Kapetyn entertained us with their valedictory address. Through various anecdotes and memories, they gave the audience a brief peek into College life and into the characters of each of the graduates.

Next, Women Assisting the Teachers College in Hamilton (W.A.T.C.H.) presented the College with a cheque for \$10,000.00! Two retirements were also celebrated. Mr. Sikkema is retiring after many years of teaching, the last nine of which were at the College. Mrs. Donna Van Huisstede is retiring after 35 years of office administration at the College! Dr. van Halen-Faber expressed thanks to each for their service.

The evening closed with prayer and the singing of our national anthem. Mr. John VanIperen accompanied the ceremony with musical selections reflecting joy and thankfulness to our covenant God from whom all blessings flow!
